Pre-Iquique in summary....

9 years before 2014 Iquique earthquake, 2005 slab pull earthquake triggers:

- Decrease of eastward GPS velocities
- Increase of seismicity rate
- \rightarrow Decoupling of interface

8 months before 2014 Iquique earthquake:

- Decrease of coastal velocities
- Increase of seismicity
 - \rightarrow Mw6.5 slow slip, 80% aseismic

15 days before Iquique EQ (after Mw6.7 foreshock)

- Abrupt increase of seismic activity
- Strong deformation signal
 - \rightarrow Mw7.0 slow slip, 35% aseismic
